

A Project That Was Meant To Be

In mid-April a request was posted on the Crave message board soliciting donations to campaign in support of David Fumero and Renee Goldsberry by sending gifts to the One Life To Live and ABC Daytime studios. After a few moments of reflection I posted the following response –



Immediately members responded saying they too wanted to send stuffed toy tigers to a children's hospital. Crave message board member Deevah4ever contacted Mary Jo Page of St. Luke's Hospital and thus the St. Luke project began. A special PayPal account was established to collect donations for this project and members generously contributed. Within a few months 25 stuffed toy tigers, a new couch, a book cart, children's books, and other gifts were delivered to the hospital for the Patient's Library and the Pediatric Center.

The Patient Library is in a building named for Robert Minturn. Robert Minturn was one of the most prominent American merchants and shippers of the mid-19th century. Mr. Minturn declined all offers of public office, except the post of commissioner of emigration, which he accepted from a wish to secure the rights of emigrants. He was an active manager of many charitable associations in New York City, aided in establishing the Association for improving the condition of the poor, and was a founder of St. Luke's hospital. Like his Quaker forebears, he was opposed to slavery. He is reported to have purchased a number of slaves for the purpose of setting them free and he was a benefactor of the Freedmen's Association. Robert Minturn and his wife donated land for the establishment of New York's Central Park, having been inspired by the beauty of foreign cities and their parks.

It really is remarkable that this dedication ceremony is being held on October 4, the day to celebrate the feast of St. Francis, and our tribute to Renee & David's work is in a building named after someone who gave much to New York and to society. Indeed, all aspects of this project – from the performances that inspired us to this dedication ceremony today – were truly meant to be.


